Promises Not Panic Day 33 4/29/2020

Psa 34:22 The LORD <u>redeems</u> the soul of His servants, and none of those who <u>trust</u> in Him shall be <u>condemned</u>.

Redeems- purchases out of sins slavery, power and penalty. With the most precious and powerful sacrifice of Jesus. Nothing greater!

Trust- flee to for refuge, deliverance, salvation.

Condemnation- never given up to ruin, deserted or forsaken, cast out, rejected.

Q. Has your heart ever been your accuser, jury and judge. Trying to condemn you over your sin?

A. 1Jn 3:20 For if our <u>heart condemns us</u>, <u>God is greater</u> than our heart, and <u>knows all things</u>.

Promises-

- a) What God has done for us, receiving, redeeming and justifying us- is greater, more powerful, than our hearts condemnation. Know and trust that!
- b) God knows all things; He knows what we often forget. That our frames are dust, we need fresh mercy every morning, He knows he has received us, redeemed us, justified us and promised to never leave or forsake us.
 - c) Produces love, gratitude, transformation.

Condemnation- No! Hated and hopeless.

Conviction, correction- Yes! Loved and led.

Rom 8:1 There is therefore now <u>no condemnation</u> to those who are <u>in Christ Jesus</u>, who <u>do not walk according to the flesh</u>, but according to <u>the Spirit</u>.

Rom 8:31-34 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us.
