Today – It's Time for America to Have Her Nineveh Moment!

Jonah 3:1-10

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, <u>according to the word of the LORD</u>. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, a three-day journey in extent. And Jonah began to enter the city on the first day's walk. Then he cried out and said, "<u>Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!</u>" So the people of Nineveh <u>believed God</u>, <u>proclaimed a fast</u>, and <u>put on sackcloth</u>, from the greatest to the least of them. Then word came to the king of Nineveh; and he arose from his throne and <u>laid aside his robe</u>, <u>covered himself</u> with <u>sackcloth</u> and <u>sat in ashes</u>. And he caused it to be proclaimed and published throughout Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything; do not let them eat, or drink water. But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and <u>cry mightily to God</u>; yes, let every one <u>turn from his evil way</u> and from the <u>violence</u> that is in his hands. <u>Who can tell if God will turn and relent</u>, and turn away from His fierce anger, so that we may not perish? Then God saw their works, that <u>they turned from their evil way</u>; and <u>God relented</u> from the disaster that <u>He had said</u> He would bring upon them, and <u>He did not do it</u>.

America needs to hear the word of the LORD. Can we hear Him?

- a) He speaks through natural disasters fires, hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, tornadoes etc. corrective words of judgement (*2 Chronicles 7:13 drought, devour, disease*).
- b) He speaks through social tragedies corruption in government, an apostate church, tumultuous society can we hear what He's saying?
- c) America has led the world in the most destructive sins known to man how can we think God is okay with that? How can we think we, as a nation, don't need to repent?

God has watched our moral decay for decades, He's watched us sow to the wind and has allowed us to reap a whirlwind. Are we too comfy and casual in our sheltered lives to hear what God is saying? Are we too uncaring to be moved to tears for our country?

America needs to respond to the word of the LORD.

- a) **Nineveh** believed the word, fasted, covered sackcloth, sat ashes, cried mightily to God, turned from evil and violence. **They repented as a nation, for the nation!** WE MUST GET THIS SPIRIT WITHIN US!
- b) **It's been 103 years** since President Woodrow Wilson made the last call to the nation for a day of public humiliation, prayer, and fasting. Prior to that, it was a regular occurrence.

How have we faired as a nation since then? Two World Wars, Korea, Vietnam, Iraq, Afghanistan, prayer out of schools, abortion, divorce, fatherless homes, addiction, crime, sexual heinousness, same sex marriage, injustice, violence, etc.

America must respond with repentance to a holy God, it's our only hope for healing and restoration.

The LORD will turn from His fierce anger.

a) Nineveh gambled, without a promise, that God might turn from His anger and forgive them.

We've got a promise of forgiveness and healing – how much more should we repent? Doesn't the sound of deliverance from sin and righteousness abounding sound good?

The instant I speak concerning a nation and a kingdom, to pluck up, to pull down, and to destroy it, <u>if that nation</u> against whom I have spoken <u>turns from its evil</u>, <u>I will turn</u> of the disaster that I thought to bring upon it."
